- **Tariffs:** Unpredictable global trade policies create significant budget volatility.



- **Labor shortages:** Scarcity of qualified local trades makes installation coordination critical.



- **Supply chain volatility:** Material delays and logjams put projects at constant risk.



- **Opening schedule pressure:** Owners face intense urgency to open and begin revenue generation.

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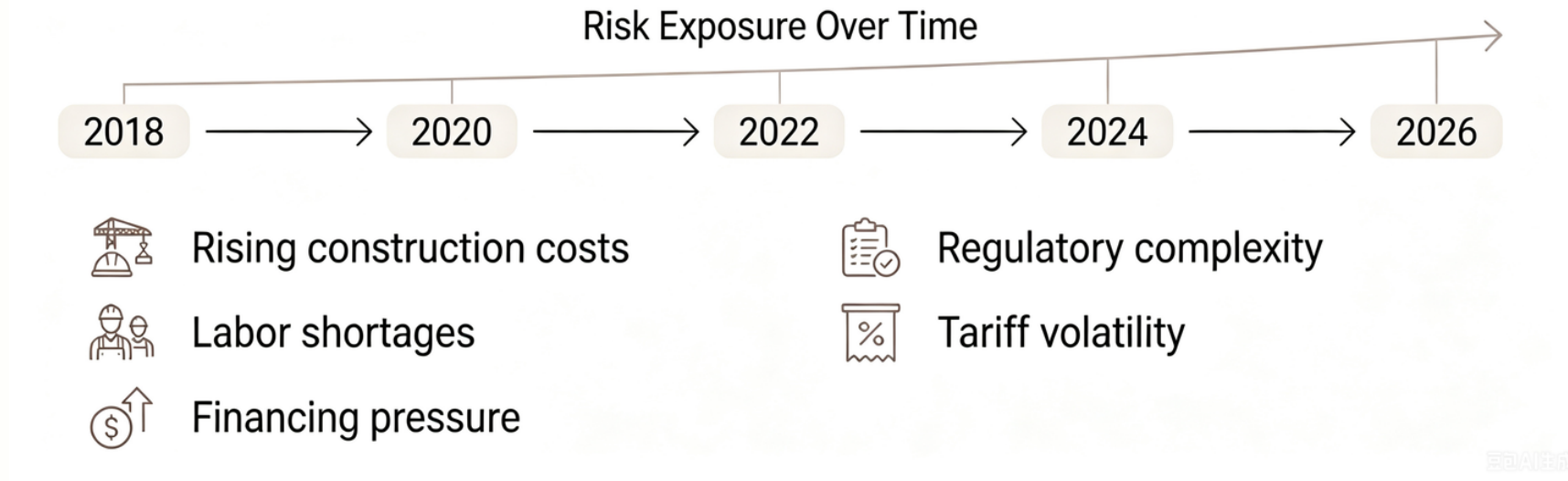

Why Hospitality Development Is Becoming More Difficult

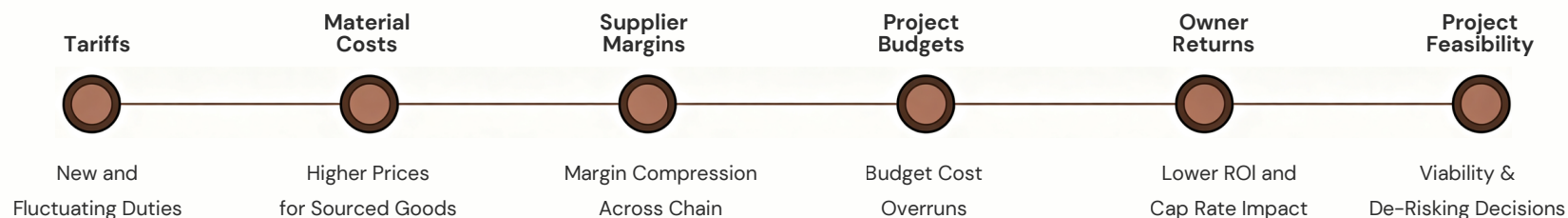
The risk environment has intensified across the development cycle.



Owners today face more uncertainty than ever before.

Tariff Risks

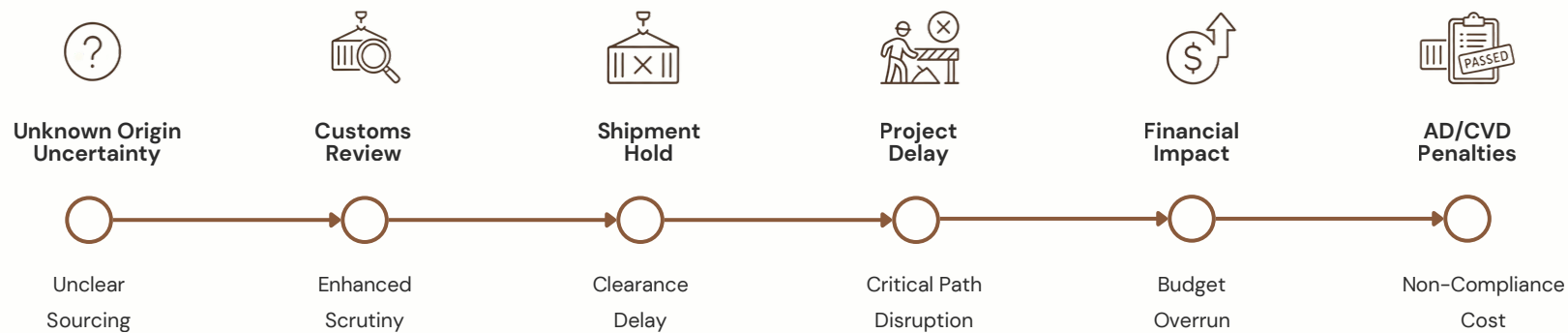
Tariffs are no longer just a procurement issue.



On hotel casegoods projects, tariff exposure can destabilize procurement and flow through every link of the financial chain-extra pressure that must be forecasted, mitigated, and de-risked.

AD/CVD Risks

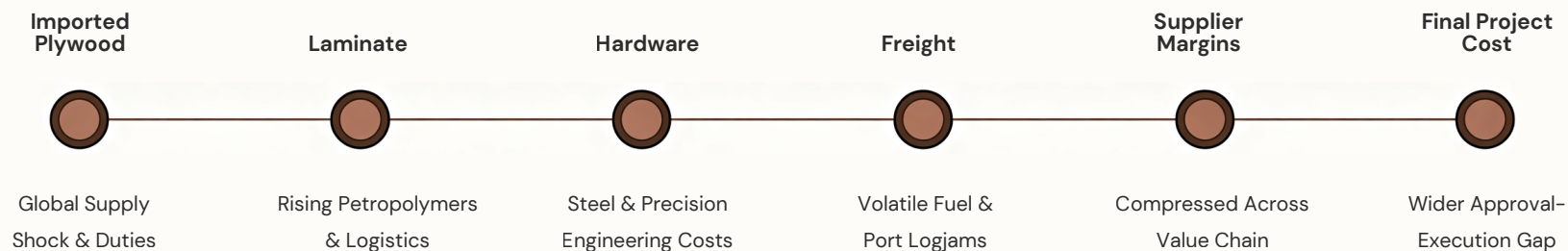
AD/CVD issues often escalate from compliance to schedule and cost risk.



AD/CVD exposure can directly affect project delivery.

Material Inflation Risks

Material costs can outpace approved budgets over a single procurement cycle.



A project budget approved today can be overtaken by material inflation within 8-12 months.

Risk #2: The Labor Shortage Reality

Skilled cabinet installers are becoming scarcer and more expensive, impacting project critical paths.



Labor Cost vs. Material Cost Trends (Multi-Site Average)



Average Cabinet Labor (Hourly) –Trending Up (Higher Risk)

\$65 – 85/hr

Increased Complexity



Average Cabinet Material (per room) – Trending Flat (Lower Risk)

\$420 – 550/room

Pre-Assembled Efficiency

Installation Time: Reduced overall site hours by ~65% with pre-assembled cabinets.

Schedule Risk: Tight labor availability for specific finish trades can delay room turnover.

Project Costs: Labor is now a significant percentage, potentially exceeding material costs per unit.



Skilled cabinet installation labor is becoming more expensive than materials. On an extended-stay project, securing a reliable crew is paramount. Factory pre-assembled cabinets can reduce onsite labor hours, mitigate schedule risk, and decrease overall installer-related costs.

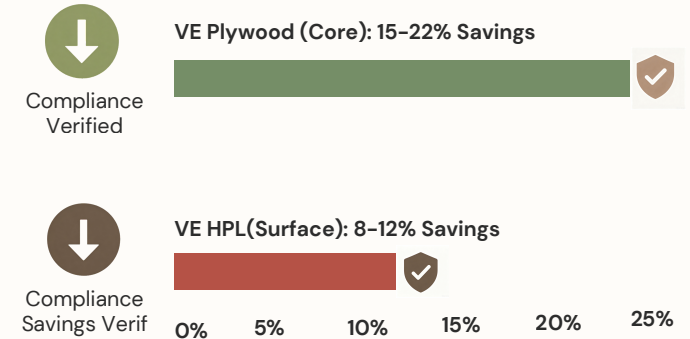

VE Saving Impact



Optimization of cabinet material specifications through approved alternatives de-risks the budget by unlocking significant savings (up to 22% on cores and 12% on surfaces) while ensuring brand-level moisture resistance and durability. Early coordination validates VE specs for final approval, preventing rework and securing both cost efficiency and compliance.

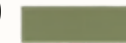

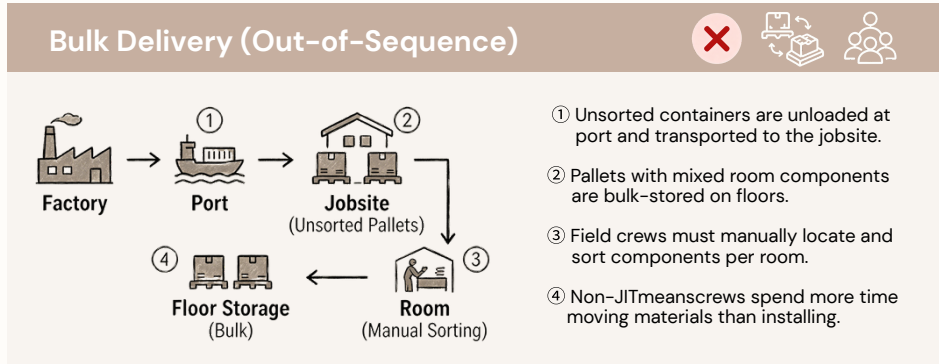
Pre-assembled: ~90 hours



On a 120-key project, flat-pack cabinets can require several hundred more installer hours than pre-assembled cabinets—extra time that must be scheduled, supervised, and paid for on site.

JIT Delivery: Why logistics matter more than ever

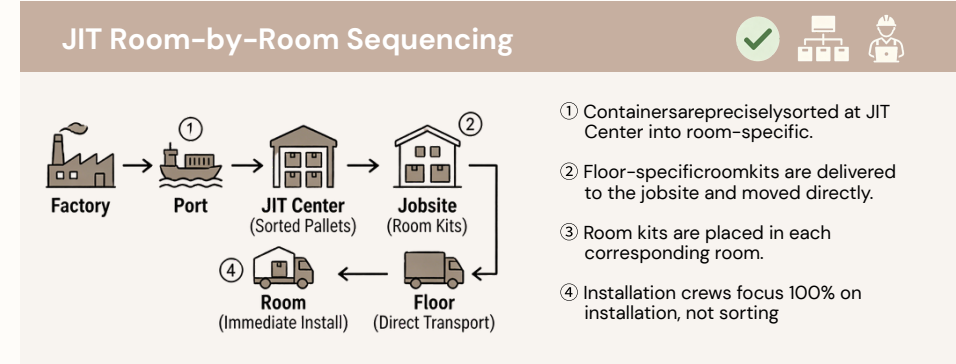
Wrong sequencing creates hidden labor costs.

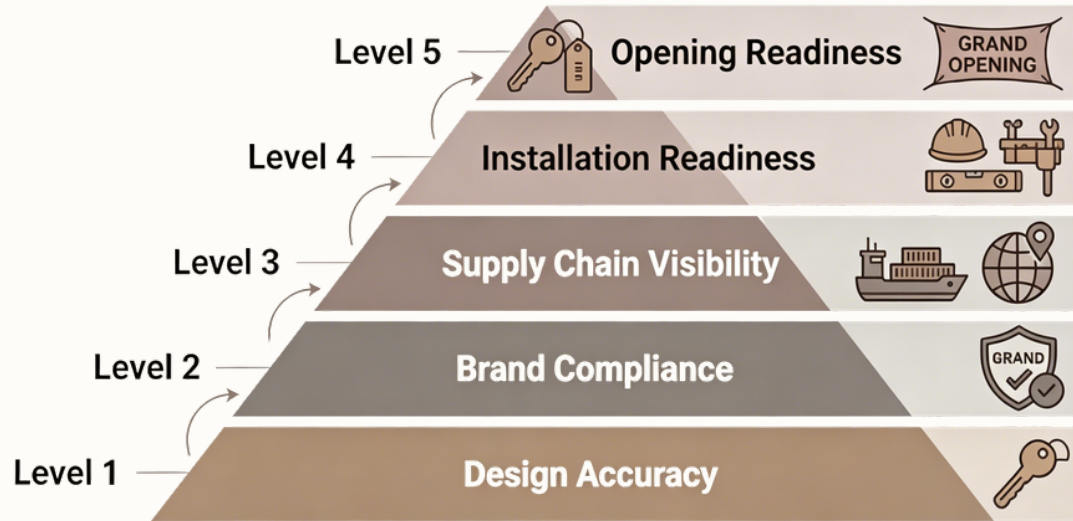

Wrong delivery sequencing can create over 400 additional installer hours per floor on a 120-key project-extra labor for sorting and moving that must be supervised, coordinated, and paid for on-site. JIT is critical to de-risking field labor.

The Resilience Framework coordinates critical path dependencies across all five layers, ensuring design accuracy, brand standard validation, supply chain predictability, installation readiness, and opening day coordination. Implementing these de-risking strategies protects project delivery.
